It was a meet-and-greet session, giving everyone a chance to introduce themselves and begin discussions around potential WG representatives. We are thrilled to have such a dedicated group on board, each bringing unique expertise and a shared commitment to supporting our community.

As of early December, the Play WG members include ACT Education Directorate, ACT Playgroups, Ginninderry, Capital and Community Services (CRCS). We are actively engaging with other potential organisations and look forward to expanding our collaborative network.

Scope

Play is about creating opportunities for children to engage in play that supports their physical, cognitive, and emotional By working with growth. partner organisations, we aim to make sure that every child has access to safe and supportive environments that nurture their development through play. This includes structured and unstructured play, both indoors and outdoors, and ensuring that parents, educators, and families understand the importance of play in a child's overall development.

Impact

- In the short term, Play will contribute to raising awareness about the importance of play and creating more safe, accessible play spaces for children and their families
- In the medium term, Play will support (X) partnerships with schools, ECECs, and community organisations to integrate play into early learning and family activities
- In the long term, Play aims to create Ø sustainable play opportunities that promote the well-being of children and strengthen family relationships, ensuring that every child benefits from play-based learning

Connections



For stronger communities

Unlike Play and Outreach focus areas, Connections will operate on a different model, a series of workshops instead of a Working Group. Connections aims to bring together a diverse network of stakeholders to co-design and deliver a series of workshops tailored to the needs of families with children aged 0-5. This approach focuses on strengthening connections - family to family, family to services, and services to services. We believe workshops provide the ideal platform for families and services to exchange experiences in a supportive, peer-to-peer setting.

For accessibility and convenience, the workshops will be both in-person and online to reach more families and service providers, creating stronger connections throughout the community.

To complement these sessions, a digital resource library will be hosted on the Village website. This virtual repository will feature evidence-based materials and recorded sessions, extending the workshop's impact beyond Belconnen and ensuring that families and services have ongoing access to resources.

Leveraging the collective strengths of our partners, we will continue to shape an environment where every child is supported to reach their full potential.

Scope

Connections is about making it easier for parents and carers to access the services they need to raise their children in a healthy, supportive environment. By bringing together health, education, and community service providers, we aim to improve how families engage with support services. This includes making services more accessible, reducing barriers, and fostering a more integrated approach to child and family support.

Impact

- In the short term, Connections will contribute to identifying barriers reducing typical engagement with services, while also building stronger connections between families, schools, playgroup networks, the community services sector and government agencies
- In the medium term, Connections will support in developing a coordinated and collaborative approach to providing service support and program to families
- In the long term, Connections will develop strategies to access to child and family services, helping families feel more connected and supported as they raise their children

Objectives

- Increase access to services for families from underserved communities
- Strengthen partnerships with schools, community organisations, and government agencies to expand outreach efforts
- Provide tailored support to meet the unique needs of each family and ensure all children have the same opportunities for growth

Scope

Outreach is about extending our reach families who face barriers accessing resources and services. By collaborating with service providers, schools, and government agencies, we aim to identify and address gaps in service delivery, ensuring that all families receive the support they need. Outreach efforts will include tailored programs that meet the unique needs of early individual families, offering intervention and ongoing support.

Impact

- In the short term, Outreach will focus on identifying families in need and them with connecting relevant services and resources
- In the medium term, Outreach will work with community partners to create targeted outreach programs improve access to early that childhood education, healthcare, and social services
- In the long term, Outreach aims to establish a sustainable outreach model that ensures all children, regardless of their background, have access to the support they need to thrive

Kidsafe ACT is dedicated to preventing unintentional childhood injuries and making a safer world for kids. Over the past 40 years, they have played a vital role in reducing childhood injury related deaths, advocating for safer environments, and providing critical services to families.

Their services include child car seat checks, installations, and hires, as well as expert advice on home and pedestrian safety.

Kidsafe ACT also produces and distributes safety resources, ensuring families have access to reliable, evidence-based information. Through education, advocacy, and community support, they continue to champion child safety across the region.






Child Development Resource Pack




School Transitions Resource Pack
